The program details have just been released with the Best of Australian Shorts screening at 5.30pm and Best of International Shorts at 8pm. Tickets are \$18 for one session and \$30 for two. The program also includes a 7pm drinks launch of the Bathurst Short Film Corner a filmmaking competition for local filmmakers. Yetholme based Film Producer David Hannay will announce the winning local film to be screened during Flickerfest. Special guests include Richard Mockler, an Orange based documentary filmmaker whose short film Wild Things was selected as part of Flickerfest's in competition screenings in Sydney and and the director of A Cautionary Tail Sydney based filmmaker Simon Ripplingale and Alex Weinress and Catherine Weinress, Director and Producer of A First Date who will all talk about their film projects in a Q&A session open to all Flickerfest ticket holders.

2BS YOUTH ARTS AWARD RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. 1503 2BS Gold / B-Rock FM 99.3 are the sole sponsors of the monthly award.
2. The award recipient is selected by a panel of arts practitioners and administrators chaired by the Bathurst Arts Council Inc.
3. The award is open to all Bathurst youth (25 years and under) who either attend a local educational institution (including schools, TAFE or Charles Sturt University) or are members of a Bathurst community amateur arts organisation and reside in the Bathurst Regional Council area.
4. The aim of the award is to acknowledge the contribution to the Bathurst community by a young person who has distinguished themselves in their particular field of the arts and to assist them in continuing to achieve excellence in the arts.
5. Following the selection as an award recipient, the award nominee will be presented their award at an appropriate function or media opportunity, preferably by a representative of the Bathurst Arts Council. In the event that this cannot be arranged, the award will be sent to the relevant school or community group for presentation. Awards will not be sent direct to the recipient.
6. The award recipient will be required to make themselves available for an interview on 2BS radio and or for other media sources, if and where requested.
7. The award is only available to individuals and not available to groups or organisations.
8. The award does not extend to teachers, coaches or arts administrators unless the person meets the eligible age and award criteria.
9. The nomination must be made on this official form. Please provide all the information requested.
10. Nominations can be made by an individual (not related to the nominee) and then must be seconded by a school or community arts organisation to which the nominee belongs to.
11. A school teacher or community arts organisation official representative must authorise and sign nominations.
12. Completed applications should be forwarded to Bathurst Arts Council, PO Box 414 Bathurst 2795 or emailed to youthartsawards@gmail.com

Guidelines for nomination are: The nominee should be recognised within their area of the arts as having achieved a level of excellence and/or consistently apply outstanding effort with regards to the arts within their school or community arts organisation.
